culture of speed viewing velocities explores a contemporary art scene caught in the gears of 24/7 capitalism it looks at artists who embrace the high octane experience economy and others who are closer to the slow movement some of the most compelling artworks addressing the cadences of contemporary work and leisure play on distinct even contradictory conceptions of time from danh vo's relics to moyra davey's photographs of dust covered belongings from roman ondak's queuing performers and susan hiller's outdoor sleepers to maria eichhorn's art strike and ruth ewan's giant reconstruction of the french revolutionary calendar artists have drawn out aspects of the present temporal order that are familiar to the point of near invisibility while outlining other more liberating ways of conceiving organising and experiencing time marcus verhagen builds on the work of theorists jonathan crary hartmut rosa and jacques rancière to trace lines of insurgent art that recast struggles over time and history in novel and revealing terms

an exploration of innovative practices flourishing at the margins of western art with this book alexander alberro engages decolonial theory to explore the dynamic exchanges that occur where the ideals and values of different artistic frameworks meet resisting notions of a singular art world and global contemporary art alberro explores what lies outside of western art's hegemonic presence recognizing the rich multitude of art formations at its periphery each with its own artistic narratives and conventions alberro brings into focus the complex negotiations that are cultivating innovation and transformation at the margins of western art showing how this seemingly monolithic framework is both crucial to and insufficient for a comprehensive understanding of contemporary art his examples include artists and collectives from around the world including iosu aramburu subhankar banerjee yto barrada mabe bethônico el colectivo maria galindo and mujeres creando bouchra khalili multiplicity lucy orta raqs media collective tracey rose doris salcedo yinka shonibare world of matter and yin xiuzhen as notions of transculturation and decoloniality continue to drive conversations about contemporary art interstices offers a critical explanation of what is at stake showing how the tensions at the edges of the western art framework are pushing it toward its discursive limits

critique has long been a central concept within art practice and theory since the emergence of conceptual art artists have been expected by critics curators and art school faculty to focus their work on exposing and debunking ideologies of power and domination recently however the effectiveness of cultural critique has come into question the appearance of concepts such as the speculative the reparative and the constructive suggests an emerging postcritical paradigm beyond critique takes stock of the current discourse around this issue with some calling for a renewed criticality and others rejecting the model entirely the book's contributors explore a variety of new and recently reclaimed criteria for contemporary art and its pedagogy

some propose turning toward affect and affirmation others seek to reclaim such allegedly discredited concepts as intimacy tenderness and spirituality with contributions from artists critics curators and historians this book provides new ways of thinking about the historical role of critique while also exploring a wide range of alternative methods and aspirations beyond critique will be a crucial tool for students and instructors who are seeking to think and work beyond the critical

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
